## **SERVICE: WORKSHOPS**

I also help organize as well as personally lead workshops on causal inference around the world. I do this through two outlets: Mixtape Sessions, an online platform that helps connect people all over the world to causal inference and other econometrics methodologies at low cost using price discrimination, as well as specialized workshops on causal inference "on demand". The former are all over zoom, the latter are a mixture of online and in person. I do this because of a belief that causal inference and other forms of econometrics have historically been distributed forms of knowledge and training that suffered from extreme inequality in training and access due to the role of selection in social networks and labor markets. Design based causal inference has by and large spread through the applied microeconomics community as well as the econometrics community but for a long time not through econometrics textbooks. As such, not everyone was able to get focused training in it. For this reason, I teach causal inference workshops all over the world in order to serve as a bridge so that anyone needing this training can get it no matter who they are, where they are or what their background is. The Mixtape Sessions platform had 18 workshops in 2022 and 22 workshops 2023 with a total of approximately 5,000 guests. Speakers have included myself, Peter Hull, Brant Callaway, Rocio Titiunik, Alberto Abadie, Mark Anderson, Dan Rees, Jon Roth, and Brigham Frandsen.
